Tarago Showgrounds May 3rd

This much beloved previous addition to the Tarago Show is going it alone this year, led by Tarago locals, Rodney, Liberty and Jay and their community based group of jousting and horse archers, in what is hoped will become an annual event that sees thousands of visitors to our village. Our inaugural Faire is being held from 9.30 to 4pm on Sunday 3rd May at the Tarago Showgrounds, Braidwood Rd, Tarago.

This year's Faire will feature Australia's only Historical Solid Lance Joust. This style of jousting uses solid pine lances tipped with steel coronels to replicate as closely as possible the style of jousting undertaken in around 1450 in Europe. Difficult to handle due to their weight and requiring specialised armour, there is only a select few jousting knights in the world who can participate in this style, and it rewards spectators with unrivalled impacts and spectacular smashes!

The Faire will also feature the inaugural Australian Harnischfechten Championships - a sport that seeks to replicate the techniques and armour that were used for duels and ground combat in approximately 1450. Come and see 12 armoured knights battle it out with spears, axes and swords in their bids to be crowned Australia's first Champion!

If that's not enough, you can also enjoy historic battles, horse archery, longbows, medieval dancers and musicians, the medieval market and a delicious array of food! Why not take up a seat in the new arena side tavern and watch the jousting from there while enjoying a delicious beverage from the Goulburn based Tribe Breweries? Or if it's the kids that you are focusing on, they can enjoy ice cream, fairy floss, an archery school and even pony rides!

The Faire will also feature a community corner, and we invite all community groups to take advantage to host a free information stall to inform visitors about our village and its wonderful community groups. Sammy's Kitchen



Beef and Red Wine Casserole

Ingredients:

1kg of diced beef chuck steak
100gm of smoked kassler (substitute with bacon, ham or smoked pork)
1 large brown onion, chopped
3 cloves of garlic, chopped
1 x 400gm tin of chopped tomatoes
1½ cups of red wine
1½ cups of beef stock
1 tbsp of Worcestershire sauce
2 bay leaves
8 sprigs of thyme
Olive oil
2 tbsp of butter
Plain flour
Sea salt
Black pepper



Method:

Pre-heat the oven to 150°C. Heat a heavy based, oven proof casserole dish, or a large saucepan, over high heat. Pat dry the diced beef with a paper towel, season with salt and pepper and dust lightly with plain flour. Shake off the excess flour and cook the beef in small batches until browned on all sides. Remove from the heat and set aside.

Cut the smoked kassler into small cubes and fry in the same pan, fry with the butter, chopped onion and garlic until the kassler is golden and caramelised. Return the beef and its juices to the pan. Add red wine, beef stock, Worcestershire sauce and chopped tomatoes. Add the bay leaves and thyme. Stir well to combine.

Bring the ingredients to the boil, reduce the heat and simmer. Cover with a lid and place in the heated oven for two hours, stirring occasionally. After two hours in the oven, remove the lid and cook for an additional 30 minutes to allow the sauce to thicken.

For a creamier version, add thickened cream or sour cream. Can add mushrooms when cooking the kassler. Serve with mashed potatoes and veggies.

COUNCIL FACILITY EASTER AND ANZAC DAY CLOSURES 2026

Waste collections due to take place on Good Friday will occur on Saturday 4 April 2026, collections for the remaining public holidays over the Easter and Anzac Day long weekend will occur as usual.

RETURN AND EARN TRIAL

Commencing in March 2026, Council began a six-month trial of up to 20 Return and Earn wire baskets attached to public place bins in busy areas across Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago. Baskets have been installed outside the Loaded Dog Hotel in Tarago and in front of the Service Station and in Tony Onions Park, Marulan.

These baskets will make it easier for the community to dispose of eligible bottles, cans and cartons responsibly. Others can then collect them and receive a 10-cent refund through the Return and Earn scheme.

In 2025, residents across the Goulburn Mulwaree LGA returned an impressive 10,680,163 eligible containers. This trial aims to divert even more recyclables from landfill, reduce litter, and support local fundraising efforts while helping keep our streets and parks clean.

All containers redeemed through Return and Earn are recycled in Australia and turned into new containers and food-grade packaging, supporting a circular economy. Council will monitor the impact on litter levels to help determine whether the program should be expanded in the future.

TARAGO PUBLIC TOILETS

Additional cleaning of the Tarago toilet block will take place over the long weekends in April. If the facilities require extra attention, please contact Council during business hours on 4823 4444, or the duty officer after hours on 4823 4500.

TARAGO POST OFFICE PARKING

Council staff have recently met with the Tarago Post Office shop owner and agreed to introduce two 30-minute parking spaces at this location. These short-stay spaces will assist with the turnover of vehicles and make it easier for residents to access the Post Office.

MARULAN WATER TREATMENT PLANTS DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Council staff have now commenced the design phase of the contract, which is expected to continue for approximately six months. During this period, minor early works may begin as elements of the design are finalised. Council's site sheds have been established on the existing site to support project management activities and will remain in place for the duration of the project. Once key design milestones are achieved, the project will progress into full site establishment and construction.

BULKY HOUSEHOLD RECYCLABLES WEEKEND

Residents of the Goulburn Mulwaree LGA can once again take advantage of Council's Bulky Household Recyclables Weekend, held on Saturday 2nd May and Sunday 3rd May from 8am to 4pm at Council's waste centres in Goulburn, Marulan and Tarago.

Each household may dispose of the following items free of charge:

Up to 2 mattresses or sprung bases

2 fridges or freezers

1 air conditioner

Up to 1m³ of e-waste (computers, televisions, printers, fax machines and accessories)

Up to 2m³ of clean metal, including electrical appliances with leads

This service is for Goulburn Mulwaree residents only, and only domestic waste will be accepted. Any items outside the listed materials will incur the standard disposal fee. For further information, contact the Waste Info Line on (02) 4823 4417.

Across Tarago, Lake Bathurst, Bungendore, Collector and the surrounding region, one message keeps coming through: people are worried about what Veolia's proposed long-term industrial waste incinerator in Tarago means for our air, our water, our farms, our food and our future. And they're right to be.

In February, Veolia used its Woodlawn Advanced Energy Recovery Centre newsletter to downplay concerns about dioxins and other persistent organic pollutants (POPs) linked to Energy-from-Waste (EfW) incinerators. They pointed to investigations near the Ivry-sur-Seine incinerator in France, noting that authorities hadn't definitively proven the facility caused elevated dioxins found in backyard eggs.

But here's the truth they didn't emphasise.

French regional health authorities did confirm the presence of dioxins, furans and other POPs in urban soils and backyard eggs across the region surrounding the incinerator. Public health warnings were issued. People were told to limit consumption of backyard eggs. That alone should give any rural community pause.

Dioxins are not ordinary pollutants. The World Health Organization classifies them as persistent, bioaccumulative compounds that build up in fatty tissue over time (Ref 1). The European Food Safety Authority sets extremely low tolerable intake levels because long-term exposure is a serious concern (Ref 2). These chemicals don't simply "go away". They linger. They accumulate. They move through soil, livestock and food chains.

And in complex environments – especially those with long industrial histories – pinpointing a single source of contamination is scientifically difficult. But difficulty in proving a single cause does not mean a facility contributes nothing. It simply means contamination is widespread enough that separating sources becomes challenging.

Modern waste incinerators may operate under stricter limits than older facilities, but their emissions are not zero (Ref 3). Over 25-30 years of continuous operation, even small releases of persistent pollutants add up. That cumulative loading is exactly why European environmental law embeds the precautionary principle (Ref 4): when there is plausible risk of serious or irreversible harm, governments must act protectively even without perfect scientific certainty.

This matters profoundly for rural communities like ours. Soil quality, livestock health, local food production and land value are not abstract concepts – they are the backbone of our economy and our way of life. Once persistent pollutants enter a farming landscape, they stay for decades. And once they enter the food chain,

they move quietly and invisibly.

In NSW, the Government has set emissions limits for energy from waste incinerators which require continuous monitoring of some pollutants and periodic testing for dioxins and furans. While Veolia might argue they can meet these minimum standards on a spreadsheet, what happens when the spreadsheet turns out to be wrong and they are exceeded? And what about the accumulation of the toxins and pollution generated within the emission limits over the 24 hours a day, 365 days a year for 30 years that the facility would operate?

Our lived experience with 20 years of Veolia license breaches at their Tarago landfill tells us the answer is nothing! No amount of monitoring, reporting or breaches will stop the flow of waste from Sydney to Tarago and pollution of the surrounding environment.

If these pollutants persist for decades, why should we accept a new source of them in a food-producing region? For Tarago, Lake Bathurst, Bungendore, Collector and the broader region, this is not a theoretical policy debate. It is about what settles on our soil, what enters our water, what accumulates in our livestock, and what future generations inherit long after the facility stops operating. Dioxins released from combustion attach to airborne particles. Those particles settle onto soil and vegetation. Grazing animals ingest small amounts of soil every day. Because dioxins bind strongly to fat, they accumulate in meat, milk and eggs. They degrade extremely slowly. This pathway is well-established in environmental toxicology and underpins monitoring programs worldwide.

This proposal by Veolia must be judged not just on whether it can meet technical limits, but on whether it aligns with the precautionary principle, protects agricultural land, and respects the long-term health of rural communities. Once persistent pollutants are here, they are here for generations, and that is why this decision matters.

If we want clean air, clean soil, safe food, healthy livestock and a landscape our children can rely on, we cannot sit back and hope someone else will act. Talk to your neighbours. Share accurate information. Attend local meetings. Write to your elected representatives. Make your voice impossible to ignore, because when governments make decisions like these, they take community silence as consent. Don't let silence speak for you!

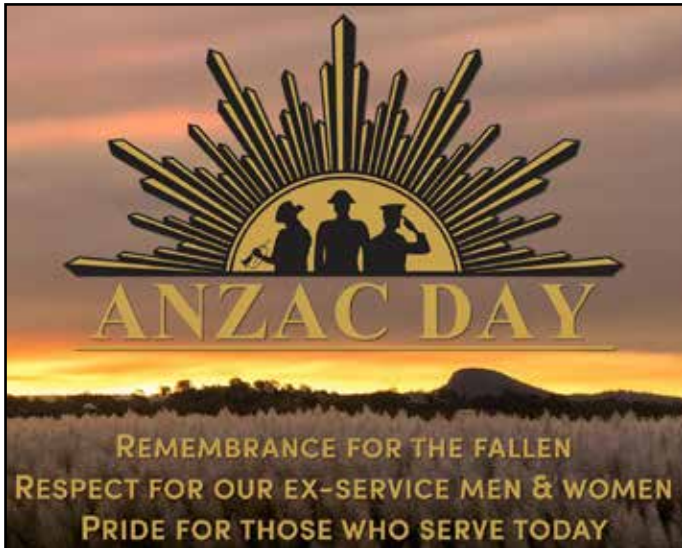

DEVELOP

On behalf of DEVELOP and the Woodlawn Copper-Zinc Underground Operation, we're pleased to share a snapshot of what our team has been up to in the community during March.

Our first CCC meeting for 2026 was held during the month, and we were delighted to welcome Emma North, representing TADPAI, as a new committee member. Anthony Hayman from Veolia Woodlawn Eco-Precinct also attended as an observer. DEVELOP presented updates on operations, environmental matters, and community engagement.

General Manager, Chris Taylor, reiterated Managing Director, Bill Beament's, recent announcement that Woodlawn continues to perform strongly, with commissioning and ramp-up on schedule.

"Given these strong results, we have begun moving into higher-grade areas of the mine as part of our plan to achieve steady-state production this quarter," Chris said. He also shared that a second diamond drill rig will soon be introduced to help extend the mine's projected life from ten to fifteen years – an important milestone for long-term community and employee confidence.

Environment and Compliance Superintendent, Kiara Crook, provided an overview of two upcoming updates to the project, both due in 2026. Both updates are around minor changes to operational methods and small capital projects scheduled associated with the long-term operation of the mining and processing operation.

The Woodlawn team was out and about in Bungendore, proudly supporting the Bungendore Pre-School Fair and Pig Races. Our emergency services team provided first-aid coverage on the day, while staff enjoyed chatting with residents about mining, local job opportunities, and daily life at Woodlawn.

Visitors also stopped by our display to meet "Woody", our popular mannequin decked out in full underground gear, helping people see what it takes to work below ground. Our technical services, HR, environmental and external affairs teams also attended several Students Meet Industry (SMI) evenings in Wollongong, Sydney, and Canberra. Hosted by the Australian Institute of Mining & Metallurgy (AusIMM), these events connect students with industry professionals and career pathways. We were especially proud to see Sam, a local resident and part-time DEVELOP employee, speak at the Wollongong and Sydney events about his experiences studying and working as a mining engineer.

Work continues on the new temporary employee accommodation on Collector Road, with civil earthworks now complete and the first building modules arriving on site.

We appreciate the community's patience with changed traffic conditions and reduced speed limits while construction is underway – these measures help keep everyone safe, both the community and our workforce.

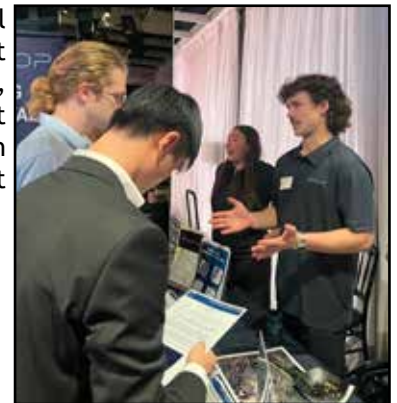

Throughout March, Wildcare received a number of calls to our helpline as we usually would - but one theme stood out this month. "Entanglement - wire", the culprits were fishing lines and lures, hooks and tackle.

For many, a day at the water's edge is a peaceful escape. But beneath the surface and along the embankment a threat lingers long after the anglers have gone home. Discarded fishing line is a near permanent pollutant, taking up to 600 years to decompose.

As animals move about these thin lines can wrap around limbs, necks, or wings. Because the material doesn't stretch, it becomes a garrotte, cutting through skin, muscle, veins and bone. This leads to infections, loss of limbs, or a total inability to move leading to starvation - this is a slow, painful death for our endemic, unique wildlife.

Fishing line isn't the only offender, with fishermen and women leaving entire hooks that pierce through the animal's skin leading to serious pain and infection. One of the rescues this month was a Boobook Owl who was spotted overhanging Lake Jerrabomberra, about 10ft above the water. The hook and tackle was entangled and pierced through the owl's wing, there was no way for the Boobook to escape.

Chrissy is a climbing arborist and knows these rescues well. It was only with her expertise that the Boobook was able to be retrieved from the tree. "The owl had a fishing hook in its wing and was trailing about 2-3 metres of fishing line. The owl perched in a tree and the line it was dragging around with it became tangled around the tree, dangerously trapping the owl. These kinds of entanglements break and dislocate wings and legs, and if not spotted by someone, they hang there until they die or are eaten alive by predatory species. It's an awful way to go." Chrissy said.

That same day, a call came through about a water dragon along the Queanbeyan River with a hook pierced through its snout. Affectionately named 'El Capitan', it took over three weeks of strategy, teamwork and patience to be able to locate and rescue El. Her rescuer, Diane, said that she woke up in the morning and thought 'today is the day'. After spending a few days simply being with El Capitan, she had earned the trust of the water dragon, and this day she knew she would be able to safely rescue her. After several hours spent on the rocks, on the grass, looking at the sky, looking at the water, El Capitan was finally settled and trusting enough for Diane to catch her and transport her to the vet for assessment.

Our wildlife already struggles to navigate the modern day environment, urban sprawl, roads and wire fences to name a few. Leaving fishing-line in the environment is one that people can easily avoid, which will stop causing distress and even death for native animals. If your line

gets snagged, please do all you can to retrieve as much of the line and tackle as possible from the environment. Someone's life depends on it.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE WOODLAWN ECO-PRECINCT?

In the past month, Veolia launched its first "My Veolia Photo Competition". This prompted some of our workers with a keen photographic eye to submit photos from around the site that show our commitment to better environmental outcomes. The team from our Woodlawn Mechanical Biological Treatment Facility (MBT) submitted this photo in the "Regenerate" category. The category is focused on the work we do to develop circular solutions (e.g., recycling, water reuse, recovery).



Captioned: Embracing the power of regeneration of general waste adding to the circular economy at the Veolia Woodlawn MBT site. It is a pleasure to work here with such beautiful afternoon sunsets.

This part of the Woodlawn facility separates organic material from general waste, diverting it from landfill and making it available for beneficial reuse in different parts of our business. One important use of this composted product is as a daily cover for waste in the bioreactor. This reduces the need to import soil to site which reduces pressure on natural resources and reduces trucks on the road.

ARC PROJECT UPDATE

The NSW EPA released the NSW Waste and Circular Infrastructure Plan on its website in October 2025. This supersedes the former Plan and includes a section focused on energy from waste.

This section was updated on the EPA website on 9 March. The update acknowledges that the European Union's (EU) Industrial Emissions Directive 2010/75 (IED 2010/75) and Best Available Techniques Reference Document (BREF) for waste incineration 2019, set the best available practices, emission limit standards, and technologies for EfW facilities. For this reason it states: "The EU IED and BREF frameworks will be used as reference points for best available technologies in this sector. Stricter limits can be tailored to address project specific risk factors where necessary".

The EPA's website also notes the EfW policy statement, "is being reviewed and updated to incorporate the agreed actions from the Waste and Circular Infrastructure Plan, including ensuring emission limits and monitoring approaches are consistent with global best practice".

This suggests NSW is aligning its regulations for emissions standards with existing best practice global emissions standards and the technology needed to achieve these. Veolia is currently assessing how this impacts the ARCs Response to Submission report, Amendment Report and associated technical studies.

GOULBURN SHOW UPDATE

Two members of the Veolia ARC team, along with Vanessa from the Veolia Mulwaree Trust Office, enjoyed a day at the Goulburn Show last Saturday, 7 March. The day was spent engaging with residents at the show and answering any questions they had about Woodlawn or the ARC.



The most popular topic raised by locals concerned the employment opportunities the ARC project would bring to the region. We have planned for at least 300 jobs during construction and 50 jobs in the plant once it is operational. Local recruits will be prioritised in this process, with 70% of the workforce expected to live locally.

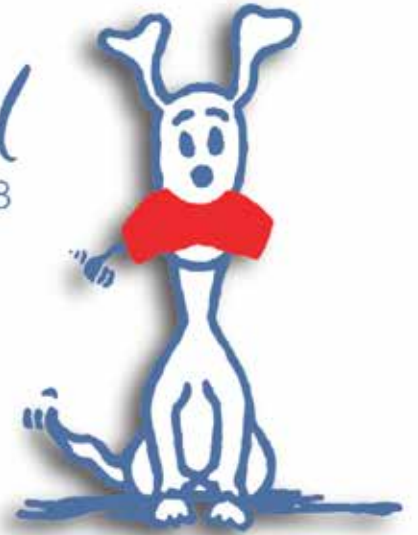
