July has been a busy month at the Tarago Show Society as we continue the steady modernisation of the Showgrounds and strengthen our partnerships across the district. Here's a clear rundown of what we've been working on.

SHOWGROUND UPGRADES

The major infrastructure program is now in motion. RFQs have gone out for the water-tank replacement, solar and battery expansion, electrical tidy-up, and hot-water system upgrade. Contractors are costing the work.

These upgrades form the basis of our application to the NSW Government's Crown Reserve Improvement Fund (CRIF). If successful, this funding will allow us to deliver a practical set of improvements that will support events, community use, and emergency operations for years to come.

MEMBERSHIP AND SYSTEMS

The new membership year is live, and the online membership and payments system is now fully operational. We're making a few minor tweaks based on early feedback, but for all intents and purposes the system is complete and running smoothly. Merchandise ordering is underway, and members can now join or renew quickly and easily.

GOVERNANCE AND COMMITTEE WORK

We're continuing to tighten our internal processes to match the constitution and to support smoother decision-making. The folio model is being built out so committee members have clear areas of responsibility and work can move without bottlenecks. It's not glamorous work, but it's essential for a modern community organisation.

2027 TARAGO SHOW – DATE ANNOUNCED

Planning has begun for the 2027 Tarago Show, and we can now confirm the date:

Saturday, 20th November 2027

A few people have asked about the shift from March to November, particularly around fruit and vegetable entries. It's true that some traditional summer produce won't be in season by November – but there are strong counter-points:

- November opens up spring produce, flowers, eggs, preserves, baking, fibre crafts, photography, art, and livestock classes without issue.
- Many Shows across NSW run successfully in spring or early summer, with strong pavilion entries.
- The change also gives exhibitors more breathing room, avoiding the heavy March show calendar.

It's also important to note that the Tarago Show was not booked for March 2027. The November date was the viable option, and it places us as the only Show in our region on that weekend, giving Tarago clear visibility and avoiding clashes with neighbouring Shows.

Work on the 2027 Show catalogue has begun, and we expect to have a draft ready for review in the not-too-distant future.

TSS × TADPAI – TARAGO FETE (November 2026)

We're working with TADPAI to deliver the Tarago Fete at the Showgrounds in early November this year. Planning meetings have started and momentum is good.

Alongside the usual stalls, food, and community activities, we're planning to include traditional agricultural show demonstrations – examples of the kinds of activities, skills, and displays we'll be bringing back for the 2027 Tarago Show. This may include livestock handling demos, shearing or wool-classing displays, produce judging examples, pavilion showcases, and other hands-on elements that give the community a taste of what's ahead.

It's a chance to show what the grounds can do and to reconnect people with the agricultural side of the Show movement.

YOUNG COUNTRY LADY COLLABORATION

We're also partnering with the Bungendore Show Society and the Queanbeyan Show to support the Young Country Lady competition.

The Young Country Lady competition is a long-standing rural program that encourages young women to get involved in their local show, build confidence, and represent their community.

Entrants take part in an interview, general knowledge questions about their district and the agricultural show movement, and a short presentation. It's about community involvement, communication skills, and being an ambassador for their local show – not a beauty contest.

Over the coming weeks, we'll send out more information and an Expression of Interest (EOI) for both entrants and anyone who may wish to be part of the judging team. This regional partnership gives our entrants a clear pathway through neighbouring shows and strengthens ties across our part of the district.

If you'd like to stay involved, lend a hand, or be part of any of the projects underway, reach out or come along to a meeting. And if you're not a member yet, now is a good time to join – it keeps the Society strong and helps us maintain momentum as we modernise the grounds and build toward the 2027 Show.

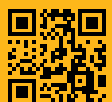

This month the Windellama SES Team participated in the AFAC (Australian and New Zealand Council for fire and emergency services) Fit for Role suite of exercise to ensure all members meet minimum fitness requirements. This requirement is mandatory from 1st July 2026. The program is being implemented across all Australian SES agencies to improve the health and wellbeing of their SES members, and to maximise safety as their members perform operational tasks. The criteria required members complete tasks that mimics the functional demands of SES roles, using equipment and facilities available to SES units and covered 9 assessment tasks. Not all volunteers need to complete all 9 assessments - only those assessments that are required for their existing skill set, or where they intend to apply for training in a new skill set. The Windellama Team completed:

Carry - Stretcher carry and One-handed carry of a heavy object
Drag - Dragging something behind you
Haul - Pulling a rope or object towards you
Hike - Walking wearing a backpack
Hold - Static hold (chainsaw or rescue tool)
Ladder climb and lift - Climb a ladder and re-stow in vehicle
Lift and Shift - Movement of equipment and stores

Congratulations to Dustin, one of our newer members who has passed his In Water Flood Rescue Test. Dustin was required to use a range of skills, techniques, vehicles and equipment that ensured effective and safe rescue and recovery in floodwater. Well Done Dustin.

Our CFR (Community First Responders) Team has also been busy with call outs ranging from MVA's involving a motor bike, suspected strokes and heart attacks. The Team has also had to complete their yearly recertification of CPR with Ambulance NSW. This has kept the crew very busy, including ensuring they complete paperwork correctly.

The refurbishment and refit of the SES Headquarters in Goulburn is progressing well. On completion it will be a State of the Art Incident Management Centre servicing the South Eastern Zone. The project enables the coordinating of large-scale emergencies, along with flood rescue coordination and it will enable increase capacity for information, rescue taskings, logistics and communications to be processed.

Training times at the Windellama shed are 2nd Monday of the month 6:30pm for CFR with Ambulance. The 3rd Monday of the month 6:30pm and 4th Saturday of the month at 8:30am for SES training.

In its July Tarago Times column, Veolia announced that it is finally preparing its response to the objections lodged against its proposed Tarago waste incinerator (Ref 1). That response comes three and a half years after the public exhibition closed in December 2022, when 619 of the 627 submissions (98.7%) opposed the project.

As Veolia returns to those submissions, Communities Against The Tarago Incinerator (CATTI) would like to remind the company and our wider community of several central points in CATTI's objection. They remain every bit as valid today as they were in 2022.

First, this incinerator is not clean. Burning mixed municipal and commercial waste does not make the waste disappear. It transforms it into air pollution, greenhouse emissions and large quantities of contaminated ash that must still be handled, transported, treated or buried. CATTI's objection highlighted the risk of toxins accumulating in soil and water and entering plants, animals and the local food chain.

Second, it is not renewable energy. The proposed fuel would include plastics and other materials made from finite fossil resources. Burning those materials creates carbon emissions and destroys resources that should instead be avoided, reused or recycled. Energy-from-waste is specifically excluded from the National GreenPower Accreditation Program (Ref 2) and is not identified as renewable energy in the NSW Electricity Infrastructure Roadmap (Ref 3).

Third, it is not green and does not support a genuine circular economy. A circular economy keeps materials in use through reduction, repair, reuse, remanufacturing and recycling.

Incineration permanently destroys those materials. Large facilities also require a reliable supply of waste for decades, creating pressure to keep feeding the furnace rather than reducing waste generation and improving recovery. Veolia's own Environmental Impact Statement estimated that its proposal would generate an additional 85,777 tonnes of carbon dioxide each year (Ref 4). Over its proposed operating life, the project would also create enormous quantities of bottom ash and hazardous air-pollution-control residue. These outputs are not a circular solution. They are another waste stream and another environmental burden for Tarago.

CATTI also challenged Veolia's comparison between incineration and coal-fired electricity. There is no coal-fired power station in the Southern Tablelands that would reduce production because this incinerator begins operating. Nor is it reasonable to compare the proposal

with an uncontrolled landfill while ignoring that Veolia's existing Woodlawn Bioreactor captures landfill methane and uses it to generate electricity.

These concerns have not been overtaken by time. During the past six months, hearings of the NSW Parliamentary Inquiry into Proposed Energy From Waste Facilities (Ref 5) have repeatedly returned to the same unresolved issues: emissions, contaminated ash, climate impacts, agriculture, food safety, community acceptance, regional fairness, regulation and whether proponents can be trusted to operate these facilities safely.

That last point became especially striking in July. In an industry article, Veolia Chief Growth Officer Kathryn Whitfield urged decision makers to "ask about operational track record, not just construction credentials" (Ref 6), CATTI agrees completely.

Veolia should therefore be judged on its operational record at Woodlawn: years of offensive odours, licence breaches, pollution incidents, leachate-management failures, EPA notices and continuing distress for surrounding residents. Its existing landfill operation has provided Tarago with a clear example of why past performance matters.

Veolia may only now be drafting its response to the public exhibition, but the community has spent three and a half years living with uncertainty. The objections have not expired. The evidence has not disappeared. If anything, Veolia's continuing failures and the Parliamentary Inquiry have made those objections stronger.

Tarago deserves better than another generation of pollution, promises and excuses. The proposal should be rejected - now!

Our recent efforts to reduce odours at the Woodlawn Eco Precinct are bearing fruit. We have seen an increase in the amount of gas extracted from the landfill and a reduction in odour complaints for May and June.

These great outcomes are the result of, twice a week, bringing independent scientists onsite to find odour hotspots so that we can immediately act on them. The surface gas surveys by these scientists promptly flag (literally) these hotspots, which are also reported to the NSW EPA.

As a result of these hot spot identifications we have been able to improve our cover maintenance, extract leachate in greater amounts from specific areas, and rectify any areas in the landfill where issues that generate gas are discovered.

These actions and the strong results over the past few months make us confident that we are moving in the right direction. But we haven't stopped there, we are actively exploring new options within and outside the Veolia group to further improve gas extraction and minimise odours.

We have also commenced improvements of our osmosis plant, which will help reduce the amount of water that is currently stored onsite. Once it is operating at full capacity, this will make a significant difference to our ability to process water and lower the levels across our dams.

This is just one part of a very strong focus on all leachate related projects. We are working as swiftly as we can through government approval processes to enable us to construct and implement leachate treatment programs. This will improve the quality of stored water at Woodlawn to make it useful for onsite applications and improve the environment.

ARC UPDATE

Our Processing Plant continued to perform exceptionally well, achieving strong mechanical availability and meeting its monthly milling target. Results for the previous quarter and for the entire financial year are due at the end of the month which will show the results of the site and wider Develop team and the benefits this is bringing to the company and the community. Temporary speed restrictions remain in place, and we thank local residents and road users for their continued patience and cooperation during construction.

This service can be used by anyone in the Tarago and Lake Bathurst area in need of transport into Goulburn.

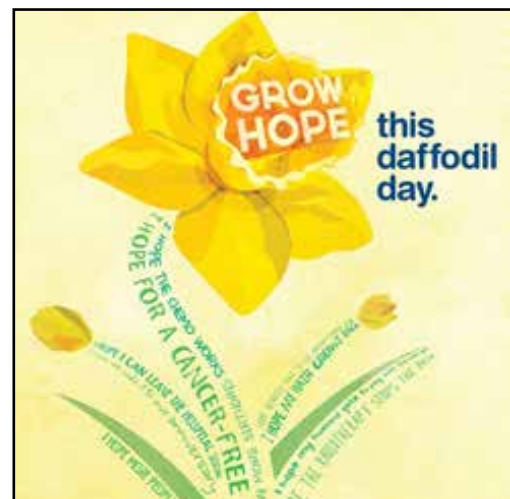

Council's 2026/27 Capital Works Budget includes installation of a weighbridge at the Marulan Waste Management Centre.

The weighbridge will enable the accurate recording of waste volumes by weight, with the data collected assisting in forecasting the remaining lifespan of the landfill.

Weighbridge operations and procedures will align with those currently in place at the Goulburn Waste Management Centre, including fees and charges based on weight rather than volume.

The installation will also support the site layout improvements designed to maximise recycling opportunities. The proposed layout will enhance customer service by enabling Resource Recovery Officers to provide greater assistance and guidance for the correct disposal and recycling of materials.

These works are scheduled to commence towards the end of September.

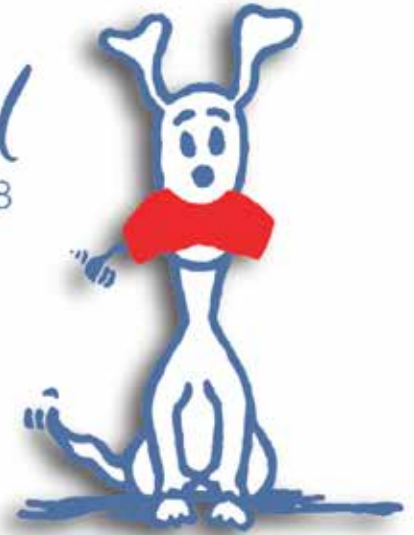
