To report all fires DIAL 000

As we now move toward our coldest time of year, have you thought about the biggest potential fire risks to our homes and families throughout Winter?

Risks include the heaters that keep us warm, the clothes dryer in your laundry and recharging many lithium battery operated appliances. Each of these can easily start a fire. A few simple precautions can reduce these risks.

"Keep it a metre from the heater". Regardless of the type of heater you use, maintaining it and keeping all combustible materials at least a metre away from it is an easy thing to do. Dust buildup on electric heaters and blocked chimneys or flues in wood fireplaces can also increase the risk of fire.

Another risk is your clothes drier. It is very important to clean the lint filter in your clothes dryer BEFORE EVERY USE. Lint is very combustible and if allowed to build up, it can easily ignite and start a fire. As driers are often left running in the laundry, out of sight and out of mind, by the time you realise that a fire has started, it may be too late.

A growing risk is lithium battery operated appliances. Recharging lithium batteries is also now emerging as a leading cause of house fires and these batteries are now being used more and more. Always charge them with the correct charger and inline with manufacturer instructions. Look for the temperature range suitable for recharging them. Outside of these limits, the risk of battery fire increases. Sheds and garages can easily exceed these temperature limits as we move through the seasons. Lithium battery fires are particularly difficult to control, as they can easily run into thermal overload and generate their own heat. The smoke emitted from them is also highly toxic and should not be inhaled.

A very good way to protect your home from fire is having operational smoke alarms. Have you recently activated the test switch to confirm your smoke detector still works? Have you replaced the smoke detector batteries in the last 12 months? Both of these actions are necessary to reduce the risk of a house fire.

At the recent SES South Eastern Zone Commanders' Conference, Windellama SES Unit member, Irene Turner, was recognised for her Exceptional Service as a Community First Responder (CFR). Irene has been a CFR for over two decades and has never hesitated to answer a call for assistance no matter what the time of day or night. We have a significant number of people in the Windellama area who are alive today because of the treatment provided by Irene and other members of the CFR Team. Irene has been an outstanding role model and mentor to other members of the CFR Team. The Windellama SES Unit congratulates Irene on her award and thanks her for her many years of dedicated volunteer service.

Welcome to our three new members - Kellie, Karlia and Shiloh. All three ladies are looking forward to completing their Job Ready training and becoming CFRs.

Goulburn recently hosted the SES South Eastern Zone Commanders' Conference at the Goulburn Police Academy. This provided an opportunity for updates and training on some new technologies being introduced for Emergency Services.

This included:

- Effective use of AI in disaster incident management where AI is used for data analytics to predict river levels in floods and to locate people lost in flooded rivers.
- Mental health and well being for first responders and how we can provide that support to the wider community in times of disasters.
- Land mapping technology using mobile phones. Police area mapping during a search will use searchers' mobile phones to map where areas have been searched, giving a more accurate and instant picture of the search area.

This Land mapping technology was recently used in a land search in Windellama. This was a Multi-Agency response involving members of RFS, Police and 2 members of the Windellama SES. Lessons learnt from the search were included in the training at the conference.

Members from the Windellama SES attended the May Clinical Volunteers Conference in Albury. The Conference was organized by NSW Ambulance and was held over 2 Days. This was a Multi-Agency First Responder Paramedic training conference. The training included scenarios simulating real life incidents and covered: childbirth, pediatric trauma, the application of T Pods for pelvic injuries and the application of the new soft collar for head and spinal injuries replacing the old hard collar. The training on new equipment was provided including the on-water paramedic Bow Loader Boats used by SES and now by Ambulance NSW and the new Unimog Ambulance.

We now have members in Windellama SES trained on both pieces of equipment and able to assist ambulance officers in flood, storm and tsunami emergencies.

Training times at the Windellama shed are 2nd Monday of the month 6:30pm for CFR with Ambulance. The 3rd Monday of the month 6:30pm and 4th Saturday of the month at 8:30am for SES training.

Sammy's Kitchen



Butter Chicken

Ingredients:

- 4 chicken marylands (1.4 kilos)
- 1 tablespoon of lemon juice
- ½ cup yogurt
- Fresh grated ginger (piece about 5cms)
- 2 teaspoons of garam masala
- 1 tablespoon of vegetable oil
- 40gms of butter
- 1 medium brown onion, finely chopped
- 4 cloves of garlic, crushed
- 1 teaspoon of ground coriander
- 1 teaspoon of cumin
- 1 teaspoon of cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon of hot paprika
- 2 tablespoons of tomato paste
- 410 gm can of tomato puree
- ½ cup of chicken stock
- 2 tablespoons of honey
- ½ cup of cream
- ½ cup of fresh coriander

Method:

Combine the chicken, lemon juice, yogurt, ginger and garam masala in a large bowl. Heat half of the oil and half the butter in a fry pan and cook the chicken until browned. Set aside. Heat the remaining oil and butter and cook the onion and garlic until the onion softens. Add the spices and cook for 1 minute or until fragrant. Return the chicken and add the tomato paste, the tomato puree, chicken stock and honey. Cook gently until the chicken is cooked through. Stir in cream before serving. Season to taste and add the fresh coriander when served.

For years, local residents have been told that Veolia's Woodlawn operations in Tarago are safe, well-managed and subject to strict regulation. Yet once again, the evidence tells a different story.

In May 2026, the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) issued Veolia with a Clean Up Notice after landfill leachate was identified in groundwater within the Woodlawn underground mine operated by Develop (Ref 1). According to the EPA, testing detected ammonia and other pollutants consistent with landfill leachate, with the likely source identified as Veolia's Woodlawn Landfill. The EPA has now ordered Veolia to undertake extensive investigations into the source and extent of the contamination and complete a range of actions by February 2027.

Then in June 2026, the EPA issued Veolia four penalty notices worth \$48,000 for further licence breaches at their Tarago landfill for failing to meet basic landfill management practices and reporting requirements (Ref 2). This, despite Veolia telling us over and over about how they are world leaders in waste management, committed to the environment and best practice.

This all follows the EPA's Prevention Notice issued in April after investigations found significant failures in Veolia's landfill gas capture and leachate management systems that contributed to persistent odours affecting surrounding communities. Veolia has now received at least 15 EPA Prevention, Clean Up, and Penalty Notices for poor management and licence breaches at Tarago since 2022 (Ref 3) - so many in fact the EPA is struggling to keep their licence summary up to date!

Taken together, these events paint a troubling picture. For years, local communities have raised concerns about odours, leachate, contamination risks and the cumulative impacts of industrial development at Woodlawn. Again and again, those concerns have been dismissed or downplayed. Yet the regulator itself now continues to identify serious operational and environmental management failures requiring formal intervention.

The significance of the latest Clean Up Notice and fines should not be underestimated.

The contamination has reportedly been identified within the underground mine workings beneath Woodlawn. Regardless of the final findings of the investigation, it highlights a reality that many residents have long understood: the Tarago region has already borne the environmental burden of decades of mining activity followed by one of Australia's largest landfill operations. Our region has lived with the legacy impacts of previous

industrial activities. Communities rely on groundwater, tank water, agriculture and healthy natural environments. The idea that yet another major pollution source, in the form of a waste incinerator, could be added to this already stressed landscape should concern every resident across Tarago, Lake Bathurst, Windellama, Bungendore, Goulburn, Collector, Braidwood and beyond.

This is why Veolia's proposal to build a massive waste incinerator to burn Sydney's rubbish in Tarago remains so fundamentally flawed.

At the recent Goulburn hearing of NSW Parliamentary Inquiry into Proposed Energy from Waste Facilities (Ref 4), witnesses from a broad range of backgrounds raised serious concerns about the industry's track record, regulatory oversight, community impacts and the suitability of proposed locations. While views differed on many matters, one theme emerged repeatedly: trust matters.

The operator of any Energy from Waste facility must demonstrate exceptional environmental performance, transparency and community confidence. Yet Veolia continues to accumulate fines, enforcement notices, investigations and regulatory scrutiny at its existing facility.

If existing landfill operations continue to experience problems involving odours, leachate and alleged groundwater contamination, how can local communities be expected to have confidence in the operation of an even more complex facility involving the combustion of hundreds of thousands of tonnes of waste each year?

Equally important is the question of location.

Woodlawn is not an isolated industrial estate surrounded by heavy manufacturing. It sits within a productive agricultural region, close to farming enterprises, water resources and rural communities. Families live here. People raise livestock, grow food and depend upon clean air and water.

The issue is no longer simply whether an incinerator can be operated safely somewhere. The question is whether it should be located here, in a region already carrying the cumulative impacts of mining and landfill operations. For CATTI, the answer remains clear - there is no place for an incinerator in Tarago!

The latest EPA fines and notices are another reminder that promises and glossy brochures are no substitute for real-world performance. Existing environmental problems and cumulative impacts must be considered before approving any new pollution source in a region.

Tarago and surrounding communities have already carried and will continue to carry more than their fair share of industrial impacts from existing facilities. We should not be asked to accept even greater risks to our health, environment and agricultural future.

The lesson from the latest EPA action is simple: when existing facilities and operations stress the local environment and consistently fail to meet community

Magpie Hill Solar Farm Project Progresses to Next Stage

The proposed Magpie Hill Solar Farm has reached an early milestone, receiving its Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) as part of the State Significant Development (SSD) assessment process. Following the lodgement of the Scoping Report in May, the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) has now issued the SEARs, which define the specific technical studies required to inform the Project's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The Scoping Report is a preliminary document that identifies potential environmental, social and economic impacts of the Project. It has been informed by feedback gathered from community members, landholders and stakeholders over recent months. This early input helped shape the issues to be examined in more detail during the next phase of assessment, the EIS. The Scoping Report and SEARs are available on the NSW Major Projects Planning Portal. They can be accessed by searching "Magpie Hill Solar Farm" at www.planningportal.nsw.gov.au/major-projects or via this [link](#).

The Project is now progressing into the next phase of detailed technical assessments, which will inform the preparation of the EIS. These studies will help refine the Project design and identify measures to avoid, minimise or mitigate potential impacts.

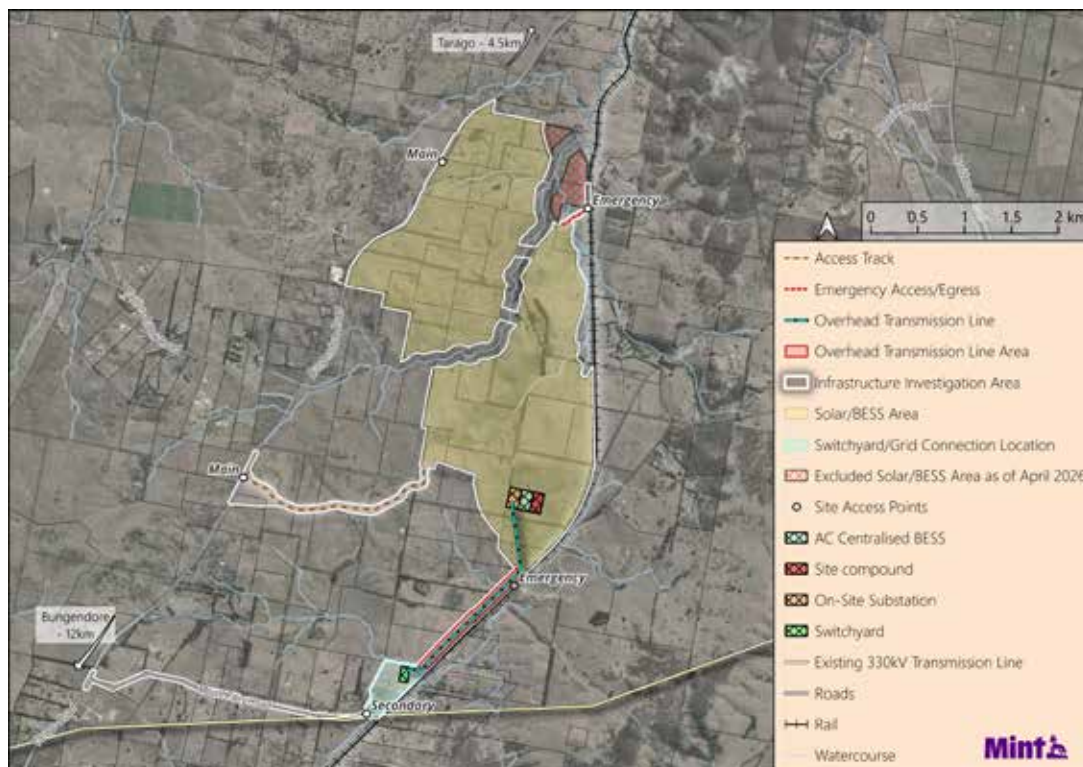
The assessments being undertaken include:

- Biodiversity
- Cultural and historic heritage
- Land (including site suitability and land use compatibility)
- Landscape character and visual amenity
- Glint and glare
- Noise and vibration
- Transport (including traffic and access)
- Water and soil (including hydrology)
- Hazards and risks (including bushfire)
- Social impacts (including community benefits)
- Economic impacts and benefit sharing
- Waste

Community consultation is an essential component of the SSD process. As technical studies progress, we will continue engaging with the community by sharing what we are learning and explaining how it informs the Project design and mitigation measures. Over the coming months, there will be further opportunities for residents and stakeholders to learn more about the Project, meet with the Project team and provide feedback as the EIS is prepared. Once complete, the EIS and all supporting technical studies will be placed on public exhibition, providing an opportunity for any interested person to review the Project and make a formal submission. We recognise that local communities have valuable knowledge about the area, and we are committed to listening and learning from local voices as the Project progresses.

Our efforts to implement significant improvements to the odour control measures at Woodlawn Eco Precinct continue. These improvements are being guided by independent experts who are onsite inspecting the landfill surface and key odour risk areas. Twice weekly they perform surface gas surveys which are finding fewer and fewer hotspots requiring remedial action.

We regularly trial innovative methods to reduce odours, however, not every attempt succeeds. We were, until recently, trialling a large mechanically placed tarp for daily covering of waste in a small area. However, the preliminary feedback from the independent project scientists assessing the odour indicated it was not as effective as other material we use, so we discontinued the trial.

Despite this setback, we will continue to explore new options and take every measure at our disposal to reduce odours at Woodlawn and improve our broader operations at Woodlawn.

Recently, on the positive side, we were very pleased to receive permission from the regulators to improve our reverse osmosis plant. We are now installing the necessary components to allow more landfill leachate to be converted into permeate water suitable for on-site reuse. This means we can further reduce the dam volumes on-site and maintain the zero overflow track record.

In addition, over the coming months, we plan to implement further leachate treatment and increase our liquid storage capacity pending approval from the EPA. We expect this will reduce odour complaints.

Finally, as part of our ongoing commitment to transparency, we have updated our website to ensure the data of most interest to the community, including air monitoring data, is more easily accessible.

ARC UPDATE

We have finally been able to resume our work responding to the community's submissions that followed the public exhibition of the environmental impact statement and amendment reports for the proposed Advanced Energy Recovery Centre (ARC).

Work had to halt while regulatory decisions were being made about energy from waste facilities in NSW to ensure that we had a clear and accurate understanding of the final legislative framework they would operate under. Now that this has been finalised, we can recommence our responses with reference to the correct context. We completely understand that the timeline for these reports has been protracted and we would like to thank the local community for their patience as the project team works to complete the documents.

The Select Committee on Proposed Energy From Waste Facilities held its third hearing on 1 July at Parliament House in Sydney. As project proponent, Veolia presented at the hearing. Transcripts of this hearing should be available soon here. Our previous submission is available on Parliament's website here.

Develop Managing Director Bill Beament said, these agreements are transformational for Develop, setting us up to have three projects producing highly sought-after metals in tier-one locations.

"With these funding and binding offtake agreements in place, the growth outlook for our cash generation is now exceptional.

"Woodlawn is now operating at steady-state production rates, and we have already completed significant construction work and underground development at Sulphur Springs, added Bill."

Finally, thank you to our employees, community partners and local businesses for being part of the Woodlawn journey. Together we are building a successful operation while creating a positive and lasting contribution to our region.

STATEMENT FROM GOULBURN MULWAREE COUNCIL GENERAL MANAGER SCOTT GALLACHER, REGARDING MOUNTAIN ASH ROAD WORKS

The Council's General Manager, Mr Scott Gallacher, has issued the following statement regarding the roadworks on Mountain Ash Road.

"Goulburn Mulwaree Council is aware that the current road works on Mountain Ash Road are unsatisfactory, and it understands the community's frustration regarding the condition of the road.

Council has issued its contractor with non-conformance notices and is actively engaging in discussions to address these concerns and ensure the required standards are met.

Unfortunately, due to ongoing weather conditions, further rectification works will now need to be delayed until September. While this is not the outcome Council had hoped for, safety remains its priority, and staff are continuing to work to ensure the road is as safe as possible in the interim.

Motorists are urged to follow all signage, drive to the conditions, and take extra care when travelling through the area until works can recommence.

Council thanks the community for its ongoing patience and understanding as it works through these issues."

Further to the above, I would like to remind residents that the Council regularly undertakes road, and infrastructure works across the Goulburn Mulwaree local government area to maintain and improve our road and infrastructure network.

When travelling through work sites, please remember to:

- Slow down and drive to the conditions
- Obey reduced speed limits
- Follow all signage and traffic controllers
- Take extra care around workers, equipment, and changed road conditions

VILLAGE DISCRETIONARY FUNDS NEWS - MARULAN

The Council will install two solar-powered lights at the entrance to Tony Onions Park in Marulan in early July. The project is being funded through the Marulan Discretionary Fund. The lights are intended to improve illumination at the park entrance and enhance visibility and safety for pedestrians using the area.

MARULAN WASTE TREATMENT PLANT - DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Design workshops for the Marulan Water Treatment Plant are ongoing, alongside preliminary site activities including a power upgrade in mid-June. The project is progressing through the detailed design phase, which will confirm technical requirements, refine construction methodologies, and ensure compliance with all relevant regulatory and operational standards. Subject to achieving key design milestones and approvals, the project will transition into full site establishment and construction.

MARULAN RESERVOIR SITE PREPARATION PROJECT

The Marulan Reservoir Site Preparation Project will include tree removal, construction of site access roads, and installation of perimeter fencing. Key environmental assessments and management plans have been completed by the environmental consultant, including:

- Review of Environmental Factors (REF)
- Vegetation Management Plan (VMP)
- Construction Environmental Management Plan (CEMP)

The tree removal work package was scheduled to commence in June.

MARULAN COMMON EFFLUENT DRAIN (CED) PROJECT - STAGE 1

Stage 1 of the Marulan CED Project focuses on works within the BP North Pump Station catchment area. The scope includes replacement of the existing CED infrastructure with new gravity sewer and rising main systems. The Council's contractor has commenced investigation works to support final design development.

- Design completion is expected by the end of May
- Construction is anticipated to commence in early to mid-June

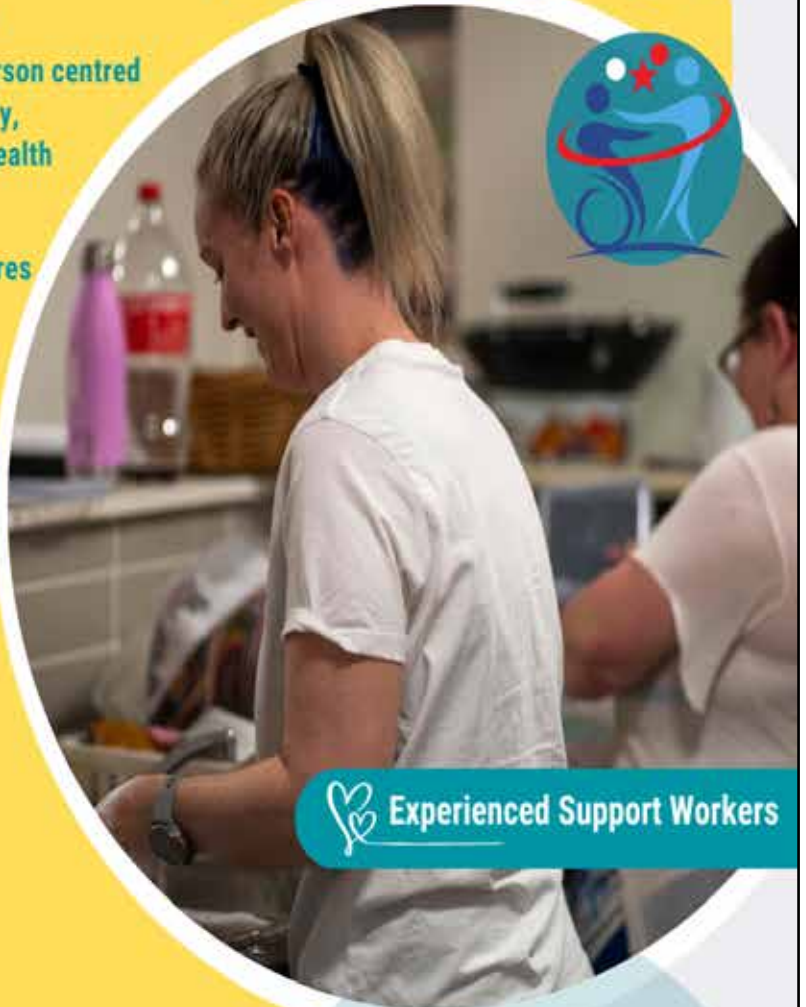

As you have probably heard by now, the Chairperson's Choice for 2027 is BRAZILIAN EMBROIDERY, which is a dimensional embroidery, usually featuring floral designs and using shiny rayon/silk rayon threads.

I have done some of this type of embroidery, albeit a while ago, but am happy to do some research, create some small designs and offer a workshop to those who are interested. The coming weeks in my diary are already fairly busy, and as I need time to research, create and stitch designs, notes, kits etc., I propose two Brazilian embroidery workshop dates being Friday 24th July and Saturday, 25th July. INTERNATIONAL

Information from The Guardian. A controversial \$1.4 billion, 900,000-tonne-a-year waste incinerator backed by Australia's richest garbo, billionaire Ian Malouf. The plan faced immense backlash and was formally blocked by the Environment Ministry. Officials found that the environmental impact statement issued for the proposed Energy-from-Waste Plant and Private Port Facility failed to meet the legal and technical standards required for approval - citing a long list of unresolved problems.

The ambitious proposal to build a waste-to-energy facility in Fiji that could receive garbage from Australia and Pacific nations has sparked public backlash and claims of "waste colonialism".

The arguments put forward to justify the development are similar to those being used to convince Australia's rural communities to accept the proposals being put to us from Veolia and other interested parties.

The facility reportedly would be capable of supplying up to 45 per cent of Fiji's electricity grid needs, helping end its dependence on fossil fuel imports. The incinerator at Vuda Point could generate up to 80 megawatts of power each year, depending on how much rubbish was burned, and would be serviced by a deep-water port.

The proposers said the incinerator would burn at more than 850 degrees celsius, turning rubbish into steam that would propel wind turbines to create green electricity following European Union and environmental protection standards. It said that some remaining ash could be used for road base and aggregate, while residual fly ash would go into landfill and metals would be collected for recycling.

"Australian waste will be burned on our heritage coast of Vuda, where our first ancestors arrived over 3,500 years ago...this is not a waste solution for Fiji, it's a waste solution for Australia being imposed on Fiji".

The proposal was blocked for several reasons:

Importing Foreign Waste: The plan intended to ship non-recyclable rubbish from across the Pacific and Australia to Fiji, a practice heavily criticized as "waste colonialism".

Environmental and Health Risks: Technical reviews by Fiji's Environment Ministry found the developer's Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) inadequate. Locals and tourism operators feared the plant would increase national carbon emissions by 25% and threaten Fiji's eco-tourism reputation.

Rejection of the EIA: The Ministry's decision cited unresolved issues regarding hazardous ash management, water supply, public health, and infrastructure impacts.

Latest on CWA FOOD LABELS - from the June Country Woman.

CWA food labels are required for all packaged food sold by CWA branches or groups. CWA food labels must include:

- . Product name (eg strawberry jam)
- . Ingredients
- . A list of possible allergens under "May contain"
- . Net weight
- . "Made for CWA of NSW - Level 2, 244 Coward St Mascot 2020"
- . Membership number of the person who made it.

For the "may contain" list you should include wheat, gluten, egg, milk, tree nuts, peanut, lupin, soy, sesame, fish and crustacean if they could be present in the place where the product was made. You can find the new weight by weighing the jar/container before and after and then subtracting the weight of the jar/container or use the "tare" option.

Your branch name and the date the product was made can be included if there is space. A best before date is not needed for charitable fundraising items. Label templates can be found on the downloads section of the member portal on the website.

Choc Chip Cookie Slice



125g butter, chopped
155g ($\frac{3}{4}$ cup, firmly packed)
brown sugar
1 egg
1 tsp vanilla extract
190g ($1\frac{1}{4}$ cups) plain flour
 $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp baking powder
100g ($\frac{1}{2}$ cup) milk choc chips
156g packet Cadbury Cookies Choc Centre



Preheat oven to 160°C/140°C fan forced. Grease a 16.5 x 26.5cm (base size) slice pan and line with baking paper, allowing paper to overhang long sides.

Place butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Stir until melted. Add the sugar and stir until dissolved. Transfer to a bowl to cool slightly. Add the egg and vanilla to bowl. Whisk until combined. Sift over the flour and baking powder. Stir until combined. Stir in half the choc chips until combined.

Spread half the mixture over base of prepared pan. Arrange the cookies on top. Spread over the remaining mixture. Sprinkle with the remaining choc chips, pressing slightly into the dough to secure. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden around the edges. Set aside in pan to cool completely. Cut into bars to serve.

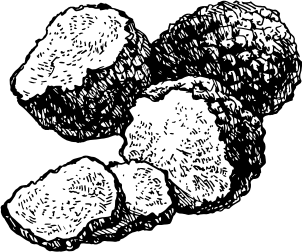

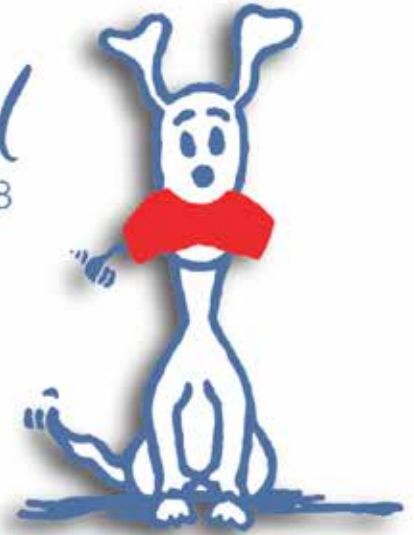
