Young leaders from the NSW SES and emerging leaders from the NSW SES Volunteers Association recently came together at the Australian Emergency Services Memorial in Canberra - a place that stands as a powerful tribute to the courage, sacrifice and service of emergency service personnel from across Australia.

The memorial recognizes those who have dedicated their lives to protecting communities, including those who have made the ultimate sacrifice. Bringing together the next generation of leaders at such an important national site highlights the ongoing commitment to leadership, teamwork, service and supporting the future of emergency services in Australia.

The NSW SES Volunteers Association and National SES Volunteers Association are proud to support and encourage the development of emerging and young leaders within the NSW SES as we continue supporting members and volunteers into the future.

President Kim Davis ESM outlined the importance of the SESVA to continually support promotion, training and support of our young leaders.

“Support to NSW SES members goes beyond our resilience training and welfare response support. It’s also about ensuring the community remembers those that lost their lives [did so] protecting others.”

Windellama is proud to be the location of the NSW SES Volunteers Centre located in Sunninghill Road. This facility is used to support the mental health and wellbeing of NSW SES Volunteers across NSW.

I have been told that there has been some incorrect media coverage about the funding of this facility. An erroneous statement has been made suggesting that the NSW SES contributed funding for the facility. This is totally incorrect. The \$1.35 million SES Volunteers Centre was funded through a partnership between the federal and state governments and the association itself. Specifically, the Association received over \$543,620 through the jointly funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund).

The NSW SES itself did NOT contribute any funding. It has also been asked if Windellama SES would be moving to the facility. As this facility is not owned (or funded) by NSW SES, it is not a NSW SES Asset, consequently the Windellama SES will not be locating there. Further, as a dedicated mental health and wellbeing facility, it would not be an appropriate location for the Windellama SES Unit. The current and well-established location of Windellama SES is on Oallen Ford Road and is central to

the Windellama Community. Windellema SES will remain situated at the key intersection of Oallen Ford Road and Windellama Road.

Australian Emergency Memorial Canberra



Members of the Windellama SES Unit will be attending the Clinical Volunteers Conference in May in Albury. The Conference is organized by NSW Ambulance and is held over 2 Days. Day 1 will be filled with practical case simulations across multiple sites which are designed to be as close to reality as possible. Day 2 will consist of speakers of relevance to the Clinical Volunteer portfolio within NSW Ambulance and practical demonstrations from different areas of NSW Ambulance and external partners. The Conference is a great opportunity for the Windellama crew.

Training times at the Windellama shed are 2nd Monday of the month 6:30pm for CFR with Ambulance. The 3rd Monday of the month 6:30pm and 4th Saturday of the month at 8:30am for SES training.

The recent public hearings of the NSW Parliamentary Inquiry into proposed Energy from Waste facilities sent a clear message echoing across the Southern Tablelands: our communities are united in defending the health, future and identity of our region.

Community members from across Tarago, Goulburn, Lake George, Collector, Bungendore, Southern Highlands, Yass Valley and beyond stood up and spoke with dignity, courage and conviction against the proposed Waste-to-Energy incinerator at Woodlawn. Farmers, health professionals, parents, business owners, environmental advocates and local residents all gave voice to a simple principle: regional communities should not be asked to carry the long-term environmental and social burden of Sydney's waste.

The hearings heard consistent concerns about human health, agricultural reputation, air quality, water security, cumulative industrial impacts, and the growing distrust caused by ongoing issues with the existing landfill operations. The ABC reported that opposition among community speakers was effectively unanimous, with "universal non-support" for the proposal.

Many speakers also expressed the view that Veolia no longer holds a social licence in significant parts of the regional community. Witnesses repeatedly described a deep erosion of trust stemming from years of lived experience with the Woodlawn facility and the region's growing industrialisation. While community members acknowledged the importance of respectful engagement, the hearings made clear that many residents feel their concerns have not been adequately heard or resolved.

CATTI sincerely thanks everyone who attended, spoke, submitted evidence, or simply sat in the public gallery in support of the community effort. Parliamentary hearings can feel daunting. Yet speaker after speaker rose with quiet determination, carrying not only facts and evidence, but the lived experience of people who deeply love this landscape and want to protect it for future generations.

We also extend our thanks to the Members of the Legislative Council Committee for travelling to Goulburn and listening respectfully to the concerns of regional communities. Regardless of political background, committee members engaged thoughtfully with witnesses and allowed community voices to be properly heard in the public record.

CATTI particularly acknowledges the leadership shown by the Mayors and councillors of Goulburn-Mulwaree, Yass Valley and QPRC who spoke strongly about the risks this proposal poses to regional identity, agriculture, tourism,

community wellbeing and social cohesion.

At its heart, this debate is about fairness and vision.

Communities across regional NSW are asking why the solution to Sydney's waste crisis should involve transporting hundreds of thousands of tonnes of residual waste into rural landscapes for combustion and disposal. We believe the future lies not in locking NSW into decades of waste burning, but in genuine waste reduction, reuse, recycling, and circular-economy solutions that tackle waste at its source.

The hearings demonstrated something powerful: this is no longer a small local issue. It has become a broader conversation about environmental justice, regional equity, and the kind of future NSW wants to build.

CATTI remains committed to respectful, evidence-based advocacy. We will continue to engage constructively with government, experts, councils, and the wider community as the Inquiry progresses toward its final report.

To every supporter: thank you. The community's voice was heard loud and clear in Goulburn. Like the tablelands wind moving through dry grass before rain, something larger is gathering: a regional community determined to protect the places it calls home.

And if these hearings showed anything, it is this: community voices matter when raised together. CATTI's strength comes from ordinary people standing shoulder to shoulder for our region's future. Please stay involved, support our work, encourage others to join the conversation, and help us ensure the Southern Tablelands remains a place defined by clean air, healthy land, strong communities, and a future we can proudly hand to the next generation.

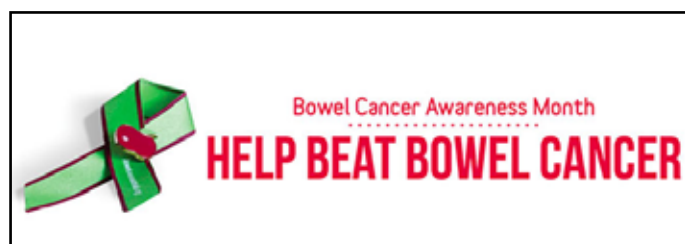

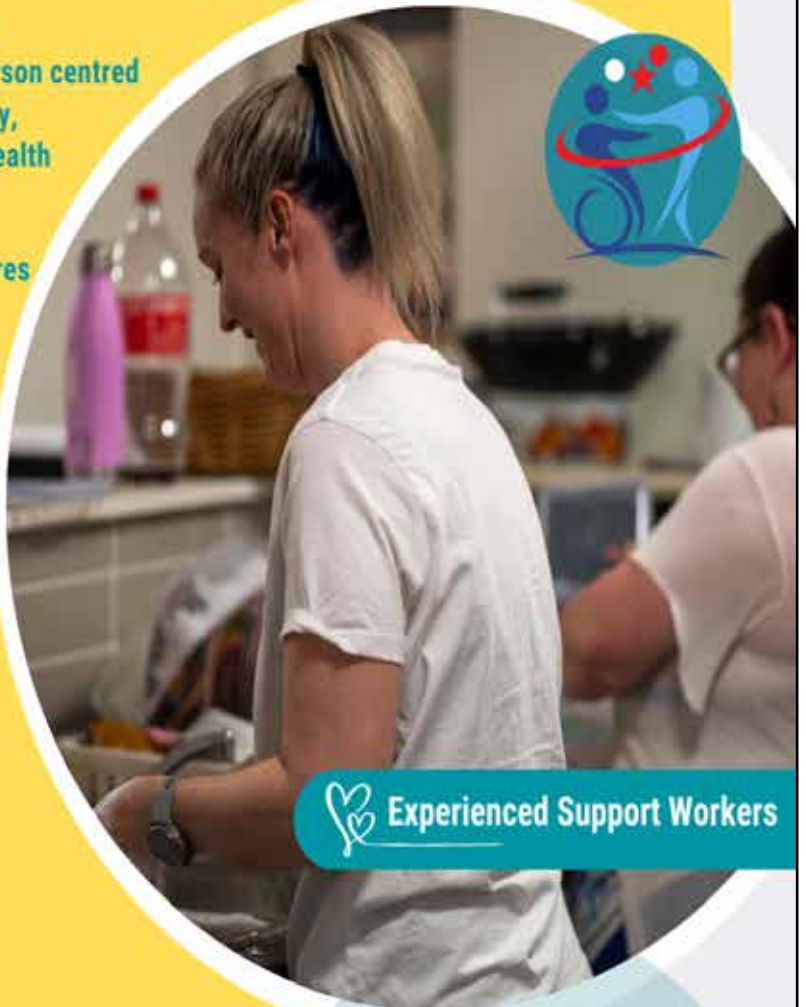

It has been a busy month at Eco-Precinct, as we step up work on gas and leachate management to reduce emissions and reverse the recent increase in odours. As you may recall, we received a prevention notice from the EPA about these emissions and work is now well underway, which is already seeing an improvement in odour levels. We have also received a Show Cause letter from the EPA following a recent inspection of the active tipping area of the landfill. The EPA was not satisfied with the amount of daily cover being applied at the site. Process improvements are continuing, which include changing the tipping face slope to enhance access for daily and intermediate cover placement and compaction. Recently, as part of a concerted effort to reduce emissions, odours and leachate issues at the landfill, the EPA deployed a team of five specialist experts and investigators to Woodlawn. This team spent over five hours with Veolia personnel, carrying out monitoring, testing, and analysis to determine the effectiveness of both the overall cover, leachate management and the gas extraction systems.

We accept this increased level of scrutiny and understand the EPA must enact its regulatory powers and enforcement procedures including notices and show cause letters to formally address any issues or improvements they see necessary. We, like the EPA, are focused on better outcomes and all the resulting improvements at the site will benefit Veolia's operations and the Tarago community. We remain committed to implementing any practices or processes that will see better outcomes for all.

ARC UPDATE

On Thursday, 14 May, Veolia also hosted a site visit by NSW Select Committee on Proposed Energy From Waste Facilities members. The visit provided an opportunity for Committee members to engage directly with Veolia representatives and staff working on site, gaining firsthand insight into the facility's operations and the proposed project developments before public hearings in Goulburn.

Recent updates to NSW emissions standards for energy from waste facilities, has allowed the project team to start working to update technical studies and related reports, so that they align with the revised policy. This will include a comprehensive review of the Response to Submissions report and Amendment Report to ensure all information presented is up to date and relevant.

WOODLAWN COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE (CLC)

The Woodlawn Community Liaison Committee (CLC) held its quarterly meeting on Wednesday, 6 May, to review recent operations and important updates at the Woodlawn site. Key discussion points included the outcomes of the NSW EPA's Prevention Notice, which was covered in last

month's Tarago Times, as well as the Show Cause Letter issued to Woodlawn at the end of April.

We were joined by Mint Renewables representatives, James Tume (Senior Development Manager) and Cara Layton (Head of Planning Environment and Stakeholder Relations) who attended to present the proposal for the Magpie Hill Solar Farm.

Additionally, the success of the Veolia Mulwaree Trust presentation from late April was discussed, with GMC and QPRC Councillor representatives providing positive feedback on the generous grants awarded to support local projects.

The meeting was effective in keeping community members and stakeholders informed of Woodlawn's current operations. We appreciate the continued positivity and honesty demonstrated by the members during these sessions.

Sweet and Sour Chicken Stir-Fry

Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons of garlic-infused olive oil
- 800g chicken tenderloins, cut in half diagonally
- Finely grated 3cm piece of ginger
- 2 sticks of celery, cut into diagonal slices
- 4 zucchinis, halved lengthways and sliced diagonally
- 200g pineapple pieces
- Finely grated zest and juice of 1 small lemon
- 1 tablespoon of soy sauce (or tamari)
- 6 baby bok choy, leaves separated

Method:

Heat the olive oil in a large wok over high heat. Add the chicken and ginger and stir fry for 4 minutes or until the chicken is tender and caramelised. Add all the remaining ingredients and 2 tablespoons of water. Stir fry for 2 minutes or until the vegetables are just tender and the bok choy has just started to wilt. Serve immediately on steamed rice or noodles.

One of the best ways for us to stay connected is through face-to-face conversations, and I'm pleased to share details of our upcoming Outreach Drop-In Sessions, which begin next month.

SAVE THE DATE - COUNCIL OUTREACH DROP-IN SESSIONS
Starting next month, our Outreach Drop-In Sessions will be taking place across the region. These sessions are a valuable opportunity to meet with your Councillors, raise local issues, ask questions, and have informal conversations about matters important to your community.

Sessions will run from 5.30pm to 7pm, with no bookings required:

- 25 August - Tarago (Tarago Community Hall)
- 1 September - Windellama (Windellama Hall)
- 27 October - Bungonia (Bungonia Community Hall)
- 24 November - Goulburn (Community Centre)

I encourage residents to come along, share their thoughts, and take the opportunity to connect with Councillors from their local area.

MARULAN WATER AND SEWER PROJECTS

I'm pleased to provide an update on several important infrastructure projects underway in Marulan that will help support our community now and into the future.

- **MARULAN WATER TREATMENT PLANT**

Work is progressing well on the design and construction planning for the new Marulan Water Treatment Plant. Detailed design workshops have now started, along with some early site activities.

Over the coming months, the project team will continue to refine the design, confirm technical requirements, and ensure all environmental and operational standards are met. Once the required approvals are in place, the project will move into full site establishment and construction.

- **MARULAN RESERVOIR SITE PREPARATION**

Preparations are also moving ahead for the Marulan Reservoir project. This stage of work includes tree removal, construction of access roads, and installation of perimeter fencing around the site.

Environmental assessments and management plans have now been completed, and tree removal works are expected to begin in mid-June.

- **MARULAN COMMON EFFLUENT DRAIN (CED) PROJECT - STAGE 1**

Stage 1 of the Marulan Common Effluent Drain (CED) Project is focused on improving sewer infrastructure within the BP North Pump Station catchment area. The works will replace existing infrastructure with a new

gravity sewer and rising main systems. The Council's contractor has been appointed and has already started investigation works to finalise the design. The design phase is expected to be completed by the end of May, with construction scheduled to begin in early to mid-June.

These projects are important investments in Marulan's future, helping to improve essential services and support the continued growth of our community.

GOULBURN MULWAREE AWARD - NOMINATIONS STILL OPEN
Nominations are still open for the Goulburn Mulwaree Award, recognising individuals who have made outstanding contributions to our community. Nominations are accepted all year, with recipients announced during the Lilac Festival on the October long weekend. To be considered for the award, nominees must be residents within the Goulburn Mulwaree LGA.

Nominations are assessed on individual merit. This includes:

- Demonstrated achievement at a high level
- Contributions above and beyond what might reasonably be expected through paid employment

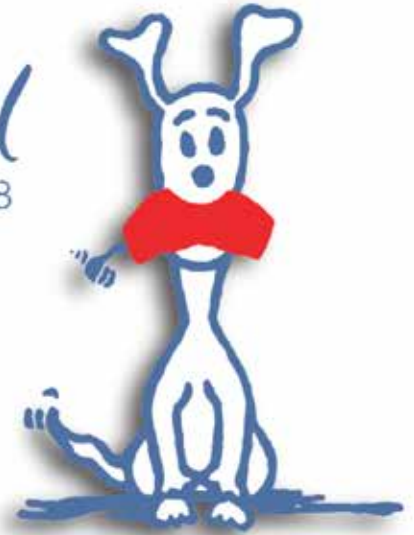
