## *ANZAC Day in Tarago: A Straightforward, Grounded Morning of Respect*

Tarago turned out in solid numbers for this year's ANZAC Day service, and the tone of the morning was well received – steady, respectful, and focused on the men and women who have worn the uniform – and still wear the uniform today.

This year's address landed well with the crowd. Feedback afterwards was consistent: people appreciated a speech that stayed anchored in the ANZAC story and acknowledged the pressures faced by today's servicemen and women. Several locals noted that it "touched the modern issues without getting bogged in them,".

A few people also mentioned the dry humour threaded through the speech – just enough to break the tension without undermining the seriousness of the morning. That's part of the culture, and it resonated.

This year's service returned to a more traditional footing. The Acknowledgement to Veterans in place of an Acknowledgement to Country was well received, with many commenting that it felt appropriate for a dawn service centred on service and sacrifice.

The ceremonial elements were strongly supported by the 288 Goulburn Army Cadet Unit, who provided a disciplined and well-executed catafalque party. Their presence added a level of formality and respect that was noted by many in attendance. The MC, Gemma Seymour, kept the service running smoothly, ensuring the sequence of events stayed aligned with tradition and the intent of the morning.

While there was no formal march, the community still moved as one. After the memorial service, the WWI Cavalry Troop (organised by Harry Lok) made their way toward the town hall, and a good portion of the crowd simply fell in behind them. It wasn't organised, it wasn't rehearsed. The sight of the troop moving through Tarago with the community following behind added a quiet, authentic moment to the morning.

Inside the hall, the atmosphere stayed grounded and respectful. Veterans, families, and locals shared breakfast and conversation – the kind of simple, genuine interaction that keeps ANZAC Day meaningful in small towns like ours.

I would like to thank, in particular, Tony Payne for his support in ensuring the ceremonial aspects were aligned with tradition and customs; Rhys for his support in

escorting the Cav Tp and its 'entourage'; Councillor Keith Smith for his unwavering support to our little community; Glen Harris for setting up the PA system and ensuring those who couldn't make the service could still hear what was happening; Blake Medway for his contribution on the day; the CWA and Dee Payne for the lovely wreaths; the 288 Goulburn Army Cadet Unit for providing the catafalque party; the MC for keeping the service on track; and everyone else who helped out along the way. My thanks also go to TADPAI, TSA, and every other organisation, along with the broader Tarago community, for making this year one of the most memorable services so far.

Time really is flying, and it's hard to believe we're already in May. As we head further into the year, there's plenty happening

across our region, and I'd like to share a few updates and opportunities for our community.

#### HUME HIGHWAY WORKS - MARULAN

We have been advised by Transport for NSW that further roadworks will be taking place on the Hume Highway at Marulan to improve safety and driving conditions. The works involve replacing sections of concrete road surface with asphalt on the northbound lanes, along with drainage improvements. Construction will run from Monday 4th May through to Wednesday 3rd June, with work occurring daily between 7am and 7pm, and some night work as required.

During this time, northbound traffic will be diverted under contraflow conditions, with reduced speed limits in place. Motorists should allow extra travel time, particularly during peak periods. Access to Marulan town centre will remain open, however, access to the northbound highway from Medway Road will be closed, with detours in place.

Planning is also underway for further highway works later this year, and Transport for NSW has advised that updates will be provided to the community in advance. The NSW EPA recently issued a prevention notice to increase the rate of gas capture in the Woodlawn landfill and reduce the potential for offsite odours. A prevention notice is a formal and mandatory framework that outlines a series of specific, measurable actions and is on top of the work we have already been carrying out. We have accepted all actions from the prevention notice. In response we have engaged independent experts to help us fully comply with the notice and deliver on the EPA's expectations.

We have also recently formed a joint venture with a landfill gas specialist company LMS. LMS has been working in landfill gas extraction for over 20 years and has already introduced some new technology and new ways of doing things that have resulted in a significant increase in gas capture over the last few weeks.

This is in addition to the work we have already performed, which included increasing liquid storage onsite and commissioning an interim reverse osmosis plant to enable beneficial reuse of treated water on site and reduce storage volumes.

We are confident that through the work we have already completed, and our plans for the coming months, we will be able to address the issues identified by the EPA and deliver an effective, independently verified, long-term plan that will see noticeable improvements in the management of landfill gas, leachate and in turn, odour.

#### UPDATES TO ENERGY FROM WASTE FRAMEWORK

The NSW EPA, under their "Waste and Circular Infrastructure Plan" has provided an update to its Energy from Waste framework, confirming that the "2021 Energy from Waste Policy Statement is being updated and will be published [...] by June 2026".

Veolia is currently assessing the implications for the ARC's Response to Submission report, Amendment Report and associated technical studies.

Visitors were able to ask questions about the ARC Project and have fun with a recycling activity that gave them the opportunity to make and take home their very own pieces of recycled jewelry. It was a valuable opportunity to connect with the community, answer questions, and share updates on the work being done for the ARC Project. The conversations that took place highlighted the importance of continuing to engage with local residents and keeping them informed about the project's progress.

Last month, the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) issued Veolia with yet another formal regulatory action – a Prevention Notice – in response to ongoing failure to monitor, manage or respond to odour impacts from their Woodlawn landfill at Tarago (Ref 1). For many in our community, this came as no surprise. What is significant, however, is what the EPA found again, and what it means for the future. We are being asked to accept Veolia’s toxic proposal to build an incinerator at the same site to burn Sydney’s waste 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for at least 25 years.

While the Veolia PR team will no doubt roll out their usual defence that any issues are the fault of the previous mine from decades ago, ‘unseasonable weather’, or that they’re ‘working with the EPA’, a closer look at the EPA’s investigation demonstrates serious failures in landfill gas capture and leachate management systems, described as an “interconnected system failure” (Ref 2).

Meanwhile, surrounding communities have been directly impacted through significant and consistent “chemical, rotten garbage and rotten egg” odour in breach of Veolia’s operating licence.

These are not minor technical issues. These are the very systems designed to protect the environment and the community from harm. Yet the EPA does not trust that Veolia’s monitoring and management arrangements have been adequate to prevent, identify, manage or respond to pollution impacts on the surrounding community.

Let that sink in - this is the same company asking us to trust it with managing a large scale waste incinerator - something far more complex than a landfill. The same company that has been issued 7 separate regulatory notices for breaching their licence in Tarago since 2022 (Ref 3).

For years, Veolia has relied on consultants, technical reports, and ‘expert’ modelling to promise decision-makers and the public that their proposed incinerator will operate safely, cleanly, and without harm. But here in Tarago and the surrounding region, we don’t need to rely on modelling or hypothetical scenarios. We have reality. We have evidence which shows that in the real world, Veolia does not deliver on their promises.

The truth is simple - this proposal to burn Sydney’s waste in our region will generate millions of tonnes of contaminated and toxic ash, while also producing air emissions containing dioxins, furans, PFAS, lead, mercury and arsenic. This will pollute our air, land and water for generations to come. All while generating millions of dollars in profits for Veolia and allowing Sydney to send its waste problem out of sight, and out of mind to regional NSW.

This is why community voices matter - now more than ever!

Decisions about projects like this incinerator are not made solely on technical reports. They are influenced by the weight of community concern, the credibility of proponents, and the real-world evidence of existing operations.

NSW Government Public Forum - 14-15 May in Goulburn  
The NSW Parliamentary Inquiry into Proposed Energy from Waste Facilities is continuing (Ref 4), and a public forum will be held in Goulburn on 14-15 May. This is an important opportunity for our region to be heard. It is a chance for local residents, farmers, businesses and community groups to show decision-makers that this issue matters, that our concerns are real, grounded, and ongoing - and there is no place for a waste incinerator in the Southern Tablelands!

At the time of writing, exact locations and times for the Goulburn forum have not yet been confirmed. As soon as those details are available, CATTI will share them via our website and on Facebook (see links below). We strongly encourage everyone to keep an eye out and make every effort to attend. Because this is what it comes down to. We need to show up. We need to speak up. And we need to stand together.

CATTI will continue to advocate, inform and represent our community. But we cannot do it alone.

To report all fires DIAL 000

As we leave the fire season the risk moves from bush and grass fires to house fires. Cooler months see a 10% increase in the number of home fires, with more fires in bedrooms and lounge-rooms caused by heaters and electric blankets.

### HEATERS AND OPEN FIRES

Prevent fires from heaters and open fires

- Ensure flues and chimneys are annually checked and cleaned, now would be good.
- Keep everything one metre away from your heater.
- Install and use as per manufacturer's instructions.
- If you suspect a fault, have the heater serviced or replaced.
- Always supervise young children in rooms with open fires or working heaters.
- Strong fire screens should be set up in front of open fires.
- Never use wheat bags in bed.

### CARBON MONOXIDE FROM OPEN FIRES

Never use BBQs or outdoor heaters inside. This includes BBQs that use 'heat beads' or LPG as a fuel source. They make carbon monoxide gas, which can kill without warning. Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas that you can't see, taste or smell. Protect yourself and your family this winter: leave BBQs and outdoor heaters outside.

In March the Windellama SES joined with our neighbours, the Nerriga Rural Fire Brigade and the Braidwood Rural Fire Brigade, for a training session. The training covered fire ground First Aid including burns, snake bites, AED operation and crush injuries. It was a great inter-agency training opportunity. Both crews had a chance to see what each other does and identify ways that we can help each other out, and how we can work together when called to an emergency. The training gave everyone a chance to get to know each other better and have a few laughs. Thank you to Nerriga Rural Fire Brigade for hosting the training.

As the Nerriga Rural Fire Brigade Facebook site posted, it doesn't matter if you join the RFS and wear yellow to fight fires, or the SES and wear orange to respond to floods and fallen trees. Either way, the more locals we have involved in emergency services, the better it will be for our community.

The two Windellama SES vehicles have had new NSW Ambulance radio technology installed to enhance emergency management communications. This is a great step forward in our area where radio communication can be difficult.

NSW Ambulance trainers, Laura and Kristy, joined us this month to review and practice our skills when dealing with paediatric emergencies. This training covered resuscitation of new born babies and infants. We all hope that we are never called to these emergencies, but it is important to be confident when assessing and treating patients.

Just a reminder to the community regarding trees down on public roads. Removal of trees on public roads is the responsibility of Council so if you need a tree removed from a public road the best way to expedite the removal is to ring Goulburn Mulawree on Council on 4823 4444 or after-hours emergency 4823 4500. The council employs staff to do this work; it is not the SES's decision to assign members to someone else's workplace unless it's an emergency or council authorises the work. The Windellama SES has always helped our community during weather events by removing fallen trees on private properties and public roads when requested or in emergencies, tarping and securing buildings, and securing flooded roads not to mention our Search and Rescue teams and Community First Responders who assist in Medical Emergencies.

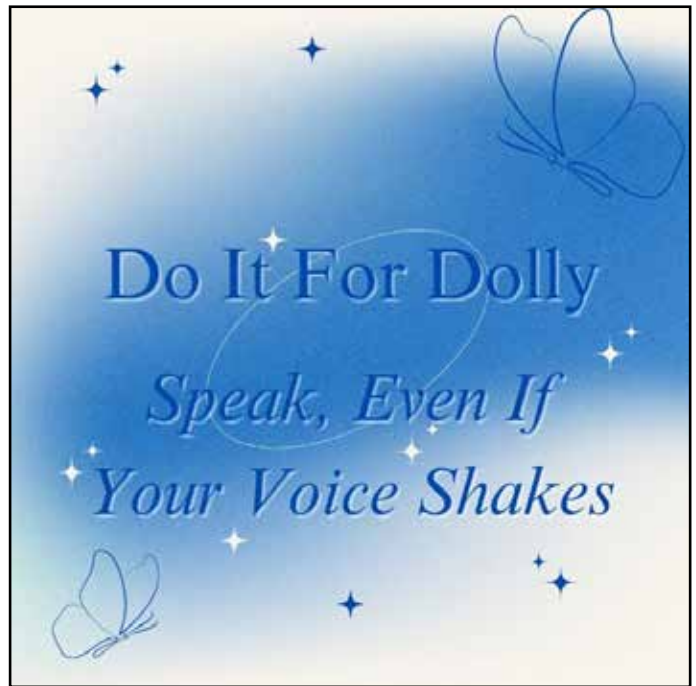

# Sammy's Kitchen



## Lemon and Zucchini Spaghetti

### Ingredients:

- 150g of spaghetti (or fettuccine)
- 2 zucchinis
- 15g (¼ of a bunch) of fresh mint
- 30g of parmesan cheese
- 1 lemon
- Olive Oil



### Method:

Cook the pasta in a saucepan of boiling, salted water, according to packet instructions. Once *al dente* (not quite completely soft), drain the pasta. Keep a cup of the pasta water for later. Slice the zucchinis lengthways and again into matchsticks. You want your zucchini slices to mimic the spaghetti. Cook the zucchini slices in a frypan in 1 tablespoon of olive oil. Toss the zucchini slices gently in the hot oil, for about 4 minutes. Chop the mint and add to the frypan once the zucchini is cooked.

Add the pasta to the frypan, along with the cup of cooking water left over from the pasta. Sprinkle grated parmesan cheese and the juice of 1 lemon. Add salt and pepper, and toss well. Once served, add a splash of olive oil and enjoy!

**INTERNATIONAL**

Education in Fiji is free and compulsory for children aged 6 to 16, covering primary and secondary levels, with strong government investment in tuition, books, and transportation. The system is managed by the Ministry of Education, Heritage and Arts, with a 13-year structure (8 primary, 5 secondary) aiming to ensure universal access. Fiji has achieved high levels of primary school enrolment, largely thanks to the government's efforts to make education accessible to all children, including those in remote, rural, and underserved areas.

**KEY ASPECTS OF EDUCATION IN FIJI:**

- Structure: Education consists of 8 years of primary school (starting at age 6), followed by 5 years of secondary school.
- Compulsory and Free: Education is compulsory from Year 1 to Year 12, with the government covering tuition, textbooks, and transportation costs.
- Challenges and Initiatives: Despite high enrolment, challenges include infrastructure, particularly in rural areas, and the need for better quality education. Programs are in place to support early childhood education, teacher training, and special needs education.

**RECENT DEVELOPMENTS:**

- Digital Learning: There is a growing focus on integrating technology into the curriculum.
- Support: Australia has provided significant, long-term support to the Fiji education sector, with programs like the Fiji Education Program (FEP) focusing on improving learning outcomes in literacy and numeracy.
- Social and Emotional Learning: UNESCO and the Fijian government are implementing projects that focus on social and emotional learning (SEL) to enhance student well-being and teacher effectiveness.
- Tertiary education in Fiji is provided by three main

universities—The University of the South Pacific, Fiji National University, and The University of Fiji—along with various technical and vocational institutions. Tertiary education includes programs in medicine, agriculture, engineering, and business, with significant focus on Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) to meet industry needs.

#### KEY ASPECTS OF TERTIARY EDUCATION IN FIJI

##### Major Institutions:

- University of the South Pacific (USP): A premier regional university with its main campus in Suva, serving multiple Pacific island nations.
- Fiji National University (FNU): The main public university, offering a wide range of courses in medicine, business, agriculture, and humanities.
- University of Fiji: Established by the Arya Pratinidhi Sabha of Fiji, focusing on providing quality education with campuses in Saweni and Suva.

##### PROGRAMS AND TRAINING:

- TVET Programs: FNU provides comprehensive TVET, including certificates (levels 3 and 4), diplomas, and degrees, focusing on practical skills.
- Specialized Colleges: Institutions exist for teacher training, agriculture, and maritime studies.
- International Partnerships: Organisations like Alphacrucis University College offer specialized training, such as in aged care.
- Admission procedures follow along the same lines as Australian universities, year 12 exams or mature age entry.
- Government Support: The Fijian government subsidises education, and the National Employment Centre assists with training placements.

##### CHALLENGES:

- The sector faces challenges related to funding and the need for greater integration, though initiatives like the “Fiji’s Tertiary Education Hub” seek to improve access to information

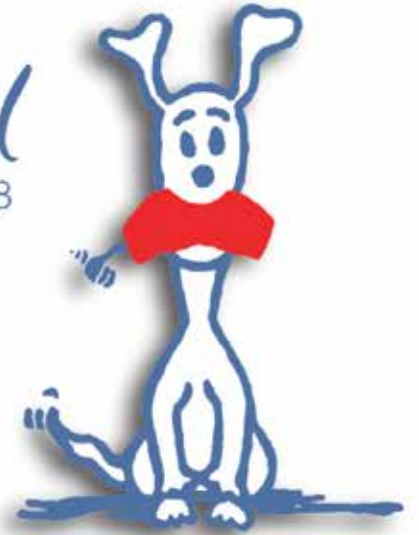
